This is a very exciting time, since we will be celebrating Kairos's 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary! Wow! Each of us should be humbled that we can be part of the ministry that God showed to the "Nine Old Men" and proud of what they started. We are blessed to have one of the original Nine Old Men and his wife attending the conference.

We also can be thankful that we have been able to help keep the principles of that initial work in place and have helped the ministry expand to 35 states and nine countries. In honor of that initial start, the theme of the Annual Conference this year is our motto, *Listen, Listen, Love, Love*, and each of the committee meetings, workshops, and other presentations will incorporate that theme along with Bible verses that represent it.

The conference provides wonderful opportunities for fellowship and fun, as well as learning new and different things about the ministry and how to apply them to our states and countries. I look forward to seeing many of you in Orlando!

**Men's Ministry Update** (Ken Rocks, Men's Ministry Coordinator) – The updated Kairos Inside manual has some new features that I want to familiarize you with that will make it more user-friendly.

- This manual has an index. That will make finding your topic of interest much easier to locate.
- The table of contents has also been improved.
- The manual includes color.
- The Roman numeral system of pagination has been replaced with standard paging.
- At the top of each page is a header that describes the subject on that page. If you want to find a Weekend talk, for example, the day of the week (i.e., Saturday) is noted at the top of each page.
- There is a glossary of commonly used Kairos terms.

We've printed up enough manuals for all to have a copy. Now is the time to put away the old manual and get your very own copy of the new one. It works best if you read it and highlight those areas you find important. It's even OK to dog-ear a few page corners. Like a good cookbook, it will show signs of use over time, maybe even a few coffee stains. Nothing makes a Program Coordinator happier than to see a well-utilized program manual!

**Women's Ministry Update** (Gina Brockmeyer, Women's Ministry Coordinator) – There continues to be growth in Kairos Inside (Women) and Kairos Outside. As you prepare for the fall Weekends, please pray for the following Advisory Councils that are planning to hold #1 Weekends this fall: Kairos Inside (Women) – Arizona (Perryville) – November; Kairos Inside (Women) Colorado (La Vista) – October; and Kairos Outside – Kentucky in November. Please pray that God will send volunteers to serve, that He will provide Guests for the Kairos Outside Weekend, that any issues that may exist with the institutions will be resolved, and that all the Weekends will go forward without any problems.

A gentle reminder: Per page 10 of the Advisory Council Operating Procedures, anyone serving on an Advisory Council cannot hold more than one of the 14 standard voting positions at the same time. The 14 standard voting positions are Advisory Council Chair, Vice Chair, State Chapter Committee Representative, Secretary, KairosDonor Coordinator (Financial Secretary – Model 2 states only), Treasurer, Institutional Liaison (Kairos Inside and Kairos Torch) or Facility Coordinator (Kairos Outside), Outreach/Recruiting Coordinator, Fundraising/Sponsorship Coordinator, Agape Coordinator, Clergy/Spiritual Director, Continuing Ministry Coordinator, Data Coordinator, and Communications Coordinator.

**Kairos Torch Update** (Kevin Resnover, Youth Ministries Coordinator) – Restoration of “disposable youth” often begins with Kairos Torch. More dedicated Kairos Torch volunteers are needed, as requests pour in from youth facilities around the country for the Kairos Torch program. Share with your Christian friends this opportunity to pursue a life-changing journey through mentoring youth who may feel discarded by society. Investing in the lives of youth through Torch's Scripture-based, Christ-centered mentoring program restores healthy self-concepts and the ability to make better decisions.

(Recruitment Committee) – It is exciting to see how God uses Kairos volunteers in unexpected ways in unexpected places to talk about Kairos. Michael has been a Kairos team member in three different prisons and works hard to recruit clergy for Kairos. His wife is the past chair for the local Walk to Emmaus. Together they are seeking ways to become better partners with the Emmaus Community, and they see God opening doors for them.
