International Council Update (John Miller, International Council President) – Here we are in the fall Weekends. In the next 30 days we will be conducting more than 100 events around the world! As the International Council President, I never cease to be amazed how God is working within this ministry. We have come so far since this ministry started 50 years ago in one prison, and yet we still have a long way to go. We have those who are incarcerated who have not heard or seen God's love. We have loved ones of the incarcerated who have not heard or seen God's love. Brothers and sisters in Christ, we have work to do! If you have not started a Kairos Outside in your state, it needs to be started. If you have a juvenile facility that doesn't have a Kairos Torch in your state, it needs to be started. If you have an adult facility that doesn't have a Kairos Inside in your state, it needs to be started.

Oh, I know, we don't have enough people to do it. I know of a state that had only about three prisons that it served, and the state department of corrections commissioner, when he found out about Kairos, said he wanted Kairos in every one of the prisons in his state. God provided, and that state now has Kairos in every facility. How? One-on-one, people talking about Kairos. Don't let Kairos be a secret! Tell the story!

**Men's Ministry Update** (Ken Rocks, Men's Ministry Coordinator) – In Kairos, there are countless stories of redemption. The stories take many forms—but with a common theme: Someone figures out they need Christ in their life, and they are changed for all eternity.

Raymond was a Kairos graduate of Westville #1 (first men's Weekend in Indiana). Although Ray was a believer, Kairos revitalized and rejuvenated his belief in Jesus Christ. Upon release and after two years of trying, he was unable to find work. One day Kairos volunteer Hank felt a nudge in his heart to call Ray. After listening to Ray's frustration of not being able to find work, Hank said, "I would like to pray with you, and then pray for you." Twelve hours later, Ray received a call, and he was soon back at his old career as a heavy equipment operator.

A while later, Ray became a Kairos volunteer for Indiana State Prison, working on the outside support team. After his third Weekend in that role, the Warden let him back into the institution as a full-fledged Kairos volunteer. After a short period of time, Ray was able to qualify for a "Blue Badge" security level, giving him complete access to the institution. His witness to the men is enough to quiet the room when he speaks. His experience of redemption strikes a chord with the men. Ray says he has never sought any attention for his story, and he has declined in the past to allow his story to be recorded.

This fall Ray comes full circle and will be the Weekend Leader for Indiana State Prison. Is God amazing or what?

**Women's Ministry Update** (Gina Brockmeyer, Women's Ministry Coordinator) – There is an old song that often comes to my mind when I hear that Kairos communities are operating outside of the Kairos Riverbanks ... it's called, "Front Seat—Back Seat," and it goes like this:

I was sittin' in the front seat
Tryin' really hard to be the driver
Thinkin' I was makin' real good time
But always windin' up the late arriver
But now I been tryin' out the back seat
And I find it is a very great relief
Now I'm ridin' in the back seat
And I'm leavin' all the drivin' to the Chief

We all need to realize that the desire to add that special thing to the schedule on a Kairos Weekend, or to take something away from the schedule, is really a desire to control, which is exactly what this song refers to. We convince ourselves that what we are adding or taking away is a positive contribution to the Weekend for our Guests or Participants.

We must suppress these tendencies and follow the program as it is written in the program manual. The program manual is the governing reference book for running our programs, and it must be followed as it written. It also provides answers to almost all the questions volunteers ask me.

And just as this old song says ...

When we are in the riverbanks, there will great relief, because we don't have to worry ... We know that we are following God's plan for our Weekends, and His ministry.

Kairos Torch Update (Kevin Resnover, Youth Ministries Coordinator) – Kairos Torch is an evidence-based ministry program that emulates Christ's love and forgiveness, encouraging change in youth who have been convicted of wrongful acts resulting in a term of incarceration. The format of this program allows the youth to spiritually journey into God's light and truth, which reveals the masks and behaviors that led to incarceration. Once experiencing this revealing light, youth are invited to remove masks, forgive themselves and others, and begin a trusting relationship with a mature Christian mentor to make positive choices for themselves and the world around them. Mentoring is an essential element for the youthful offenders to make lasting changes in their lives.

We are in need of mentors! As a committee of one, please help us recruit Christian mentors who have a heart for hurting incarcerated youth!

Recruit Without Saying a Word! (Recruitment Committee) – The Kairos Pullup Banners are a great recruiting tool. These banners have wonderful graphics with a very effective message—Matthew 25:26. They generate a lot of interest and conversation and are a successful way to get the Kairos message out. The banners are a perfect visual aid for presentations to groups and organizations, and for seasonal fund raisers at a store or mall.
