International Council Update (Tom McCarty, International Council President)

Hello all, and Happy and Blessed New Year to everyone. For this month's thought, I thank new Kairos Board member Mary Ketter. At our Fall Board retreat, Mary presented these excellent reflections on unity, using Romans 15:7 as her key scripture: *"Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God."*

If we are serious about living a life of Christian faith, she said, we must keep in mind how our actions affect others. We cannot grow in faith all by ourselves; nor may we forget to tend to the well-being of others. Even if we have broad diversity, there can be unity when our shared focus and purpose are about loving God and neighbor. Mutual hospitality is a vital part of building unity as God's people. We build unity when we look out for one another.

This means we are to help others out, even when it might not be convenient. Paul speaks directly to believers who are "strong," including himself in that grouping, because those who consider themselves "strong" can easily be tempted to look down on others who are not like them.

Going even further, Paul says we are to accept one another just as Christ has accepted us just as we are, with plenty of faults. We have all experienced being let down by other people, and we have all been guilty of letting others down.

Women's Ministry Update (Gina Brockmeyer, Women's Ministry Coordinator)

This week I received a phone call from a lady who was interested in sending her friend to a Kairos Outside Weekend. She knew very little about Kairos. She had heard about the ministry from her friend's son who is incarcerated. The young man is not a Kairos graduate, but he shared with her that he heard about the ministry from other inmates in his housing unit, and at his job within the institution. Those inmates whose wives and mothers had attended a Kairos Outside Weekend told him about Kairos, and

they encouraged him to send his mother. The women who called said his fellow inmates talked with him about the impact of the Weekend on their loved ones, the positive impact it had on their families, and ultimately the impact it had on them. The testimonies of those inmates convinced her friend's son that he needed to do whatever he could to get his mother on a Kairos Outside Weekend.

As I listened to what the women was saying and shared more with her about Kairos and our three programs it suddenly hit me. Are we encouraging our graduates, and other inmates who have loved ones who have attended Kairos Outside, to talk about the program, to share their loved ones' experiences, and the impact the Weekend either on them, their family or their loved one with fellow inmates?

If not, why not? Inmates who have a loved one who has been on a Kairos Outside Weekend may be one of the best untapped resources we have for getting Guests to Kairos Outside Weekends.

At your next Kairos Continuing Ministry event encourage your Kairos graduates, and anyone they know who has had a loved one that attended Kairos Outside, to share with all the inmates in their housing unit, on their job, or anywhere they can about Kairos Outside. Encourage them to tell the other inmates how they and their families can benefit from their loved ones attending a Weekend.

After all, we all know inmates listen to other inmates.

Kairos Torch Update (Kevin Reslover, Youth Ministry Coordinator)

The Bible has a lot to say about new beginnings and fresh starts: Lamentations 3:22-23 speaks of God's mercy being new with every sunrise. In II Corinthians 5:17, it declares that old things pass away and instructs us to behold (take notice) that all things become new, for those that are in Christ Jesus.

The New Year is often a time when we set new goals to change old behaviors, accomplish a personal goal, or otherwise improve our life in some way. One study found 46% of participants who made common New Year's resolutions (e.g. weight loss, exercise programs, quitting smoking) were likely to succeed, over ten times as among those deciding to make life changes at other times of the year. (Norcross, JC, Mrykalo, MS, Blagys, MD, J. Clin. Psych. 58: 397-405. 2009).

Goal setting has great value in our lives. It gives us something to strive toward and a road map to maneuver through life's journey. It helps us not to dwell in past accomplishment or failures and we learn many great lessons along the way. Paul says it best in Philippians 3:13-14, *"Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."*

As 2018 comes to an end, we in the Kairos Family are wrapping-up our 5 year Strategic Plan for 2014-2018, and have set course for the next five years (2019-2023). I highly recommend all Kairos Torch volunteers to go to www.MyKairos.org and check out the 5 Year Strategic Plan, as our roadmap towards "the high calling" can be found in it. New One or Two Day Retreat Topics and Themed Talks Available

All residents who have attended a 3 ½ day Weekend can attend a one or two-day Retreat held twice yearly at institutions as part of the Kairos Continuing Ministry. Retreats are typically held at the mid-point between Kairos Weekends. The primary purpose of the Retreats is to give those not grouping some experience with the process of becoming vulnerable to other people in the small group setting. Additionally, Retreats provide an opportunity for those who have drifted away from the Kairos community to return. The importance of these Retreats cannot be overstated. If you are not doing Retreats, talk with your facility about the possibility of adding them.

Communities are always looking for Retreat ideas, and to keep our Continuing Ministry new and exciting we have just added seven new Retreat topics with themed-talks to mykairos.org which can be used for your local Retreats. On pages 328-343 of the Kairos Inside Program Manual you will also find information regarding the Retreat including topics, themed-talks, and a proposed schedule.
