gifts for their mentee. However, understanding the importance of their consistent attendance in the life of their mentee is vital. A wise and balanced mentor will not abandon their family responsibilities for their mentee, nor will they skip their scheduled time with the mentee because of the holidays. Physical gifts are often forgotten but the gift of time and focused conversation can last a life time.

**Monthly Mentoring Tip:** Don't assume your mentee knows the true story of Christmas. During the Christmas holidays share with your mentee the birth of Christ and why it is such a powerful and personal gift for them.
