Much Work to be Done

According to the Sentencing Project there are 2.2 million incarcerated men and women in the United States. Many of those men and women have female family members or friends who are "doing time" right along with them. Reaching those hurting women, to let them know they are not alone, is the essence of the Kairos Outside program. During the 2 ½ Weekend the women are introduced to a supportive, non-judging Christian community as they explore and deal with many of the issues affecting those who are impacted by incarceration. Participation in quarterly reunions and S.W.A.P (Share, Witness, Accountability, and Prayer groups) following the Weekend keep the women connected and provide the opportunity for continuing to support while helping them grow in their faith in Christ.

Over and over last week at our annual conference we heard testimony after testimony of the "impact" Kairos Inside, Kairos Outside, and Kairos Torch have had and continue to have on individuals, youth, and families. The testimonies were both empowering and challenging! The statistics referenced above clearly show there are still many who have been impacted by incarceration that we need to reach with the message of Christ's transforming love and forgiveness. But it is also very clear our ministry cannot happen without dedicated volunteers who are **ALL IN... ALL IN** for Christ, and **ALL IN** for Kairos.

I want to take this opportunity to thank our volunteers for all you have done and continue to do for Kairos. God is truly being glorified through you as you willingly and faithfully serve. Let us be **ALL IN** for Christ as we continue to meet with Kairos Torch Participants for as much as six months after their Weekend for one to one mentoring in a group setting using the tools the Lord has given. The mentoring sessions have been wrapped in the Lord's love as each meeting begins with prayer, a passage of scripture for focus and discussion to carry over to real life experiences and challenges, and closes with prayer. 

Retreats are typically held at the mid-point between Kairos Inside Weekends. The primary purpose of the Retreats is to give those not grouping some experience with the process of becoming vulnerable to other people in the small group setting. Additionally, Retreats provide an opportunity for those who have drifted away from the Kairos community to return. The importance of these Retreats cannot be overstated. If you are not doing Retreats, talk with your facility about the possibility of adding them.
